

2024 WRDA Guidelines for Submission Requests

Congressman John Duarte (CA-13)

The House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee recently opened the Water Resources and Development Act (WRDA) 2024 portal for Members of Congress to submit projects for consideration in the final bill text. Our office highly encourages local communities and stakeholders to submit requests for local U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) projects. WRDA authorizes studies and projects within the scope of the USACE's Civil Works mission area: "navigation; flood, hurricane, and storm damage reduction; shoreline protection; and ecosystem restoration." Additionally, WRDA authorizes Environmental Infrastructure (EI) assistance to support local governments in either designing or constructing specific water and wastewater infrastructure.

Our office can make the following requests as the committee drafts the 2024 WRDA bill.

- 1. Authorization of a new USACE feasibility study
- 2. Authorization of a new USACE construction project (a feasibility study must be completed to submit this request)
- 3. Authorization of a specific EI assistance
- 4. Modification of an existing USACE feasibility study
- 5. Modification of an existing USACE project
- 6. Deauthorization of an existing USACE project
- 7. Requests to transfer, exchange, or convey lands or real property owned by the Corps
- 8. Modify an existing easement held by the Corps over property
- 9. Modification of a national USACE carries out its general missions and authorities

To submit a request for #1-3, please fill out the appropriate form and send the completed form to william.Ahlquist4@mail.house.gov. He will reach out to you should any additional information be needed or clarifying questions arise regarding your submission. For all other requests, please email William.Ahlquist for more information on submission. You may submit multiple requests, however if you do, please rank your requests in order of priority. Please have all requests emailed to William Ahlquist by 5pm.PT, Wednesday January 3rd. Any requests sent after the deadline will not be considered. Please keep in mind that submitting a request does not guarantee that this request will be summitted to the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee or ensure that the House Transportation Infrastructure Committee will include this request in the final version of the 2024 WRDA.

Below I have included additional information that will be helpful as you draft your requests:

Process for Corps Feasibility Studies and Projects

- 1. Congress Authorizes a Feasibility Study (7001 Report)
- 2. Congress appropriates the necessary funding to conduct the study through the House Appropriations Committee
- 3. The USACE then conducts the study and issues the final report to Congress
- 4. Based on the findings of the report, Congress authorizes construction of the funding
- 5. Congress appropriates funding for construction

If you choose to submit a request regarding a USACE Feasibility Study and Project, please identify what stage your project is currently in. Our office is only able to submit requests for the 2024 WRDA if they are currently in Steps #1 and #4, if your project is in the other listed stages, we are unable to process those requests currently but please contact my office at (202) 225-1947 for other avenues in the future.

Environmental Infrastructure (EI) Requests

Since 1992, Congress has the authority to authorize the USACE to carry out infrastructure projects that seek to address local water supply, wastewater, and stormwater projects that are publicly-owned. If you would like to discuss or submit the possibility of an EI project to be included as one of your 2024 WRDA requests please reach out to William Ahlquist.

Local Cost Share

It is important to note that most studies and projects will require a nonfederal sponsor to share the cost and provide the required land and real estate to share the cost. Additionally, most flood risk reduction, ecosystem restoration, and EI projects are owned by nonfederal entities and these entities will be responsible for the full cost of operations, repairs, and other costs following completion of the project. While these costs vary with the project please reach out to William Ahlquist if you have any questions regarding the local cost share for your submissions.
